Conflict Resolution

“Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice.”

Ephesians 4:31

Every good story has a conflict and a resolution—but it’s more fun to watch in a movie than to experience in real life. In real life, conflicts often result in misunderstandings. One of the critical roles we play as parent is Referee to make sure conflicts get resolved in biblical ways. Here are some rules of the game I, as Referee, have discovered helpful to teach players (my kids): **Don’t say things about others that are untrue or unkind; rather, be positive and kind in your words and actions. When you have a problem with someone, go directly to that person and talk calmly about it. Say you’re sorry for your part in the conflict. Forgive the other person.**

Try This:

When you watch a show or movie with your kids, see if you can identify the conflict and resolution in the storyline.
