Good Choice!

Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.

Galatians 6:2

I want my kids to practice important skills now that they'll use when they are older. Just like practicing pitching or piano, I want them to practice making good choices now so that they are skilled in this as they grow. At bedtime, mealtimes, or in the car, we have conversations about important things, like doing what's right in the eyes of Jesus even when others don't. I may ask them, "What could you do if others were picking on a kid at school?" If they're not sure, I give them some options: You can stand up for the one being picked on; you can tell the other kid to back off; you can get an adult's help. I tell them that most kids will stop if someone stands up to them.

Try This:

You've probably heard the old saying, "Catch them doing good!" I tell my kids whenever I see or hear of people doing good. I encourage them to tell me about times they've seen others do good, as well. **When we do good to others, it makes God happy, makes them happy, and makes us happy, too!** Looking for others doing good makes us more aware of opportunities to help others ourselves!
